The City Council conducted a Work Session/Virtual Town Hall Meeting on September 14, 2022. The Work Session was open to the public and provided another opportunity to engage the public in the process. The City has \$3,022,172 in available ARPA funds and is currently considering 17 potential projects for funding. The City received emails prior to the meeting as well as online and in-person comments during the meeting with additional funding recommendations from the public. After considering all the information, the City Council reached consensus on allocating the funds and directed the City Manager to prepare an action item for the October 5, 2022, Regular Session for decision. The allocations were to fund the Eastside Housing Water and Sewer Infrastructure Project, various Street Projects, and up to \$250,000 of gap funding for water and sewer improvements at the Union County Fairgrounds, contingent upon the outcome of outstanding funding requests.
